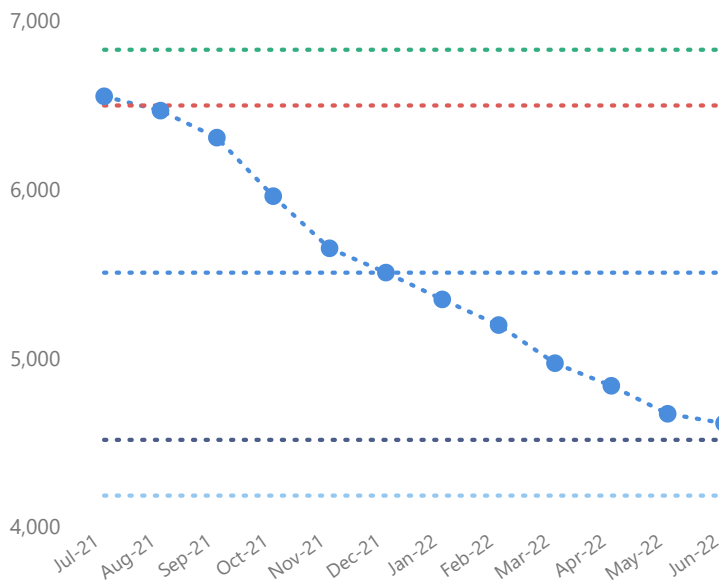

Rolling 12 Months Stop & search Volumes Force and Divisions Breakdown

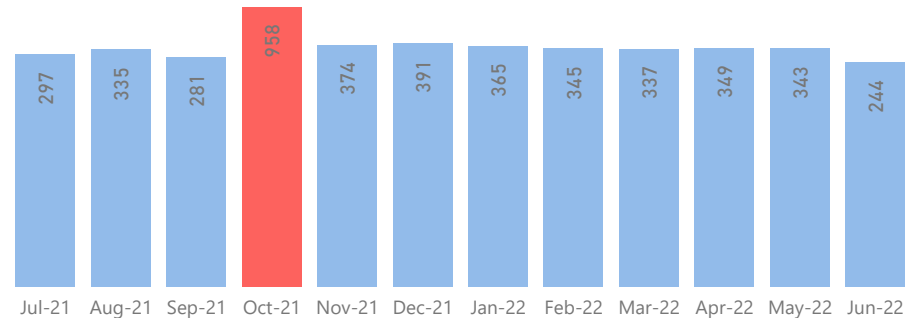

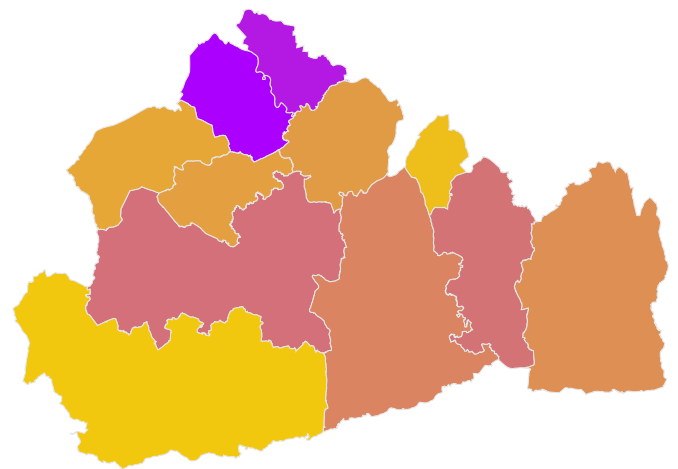

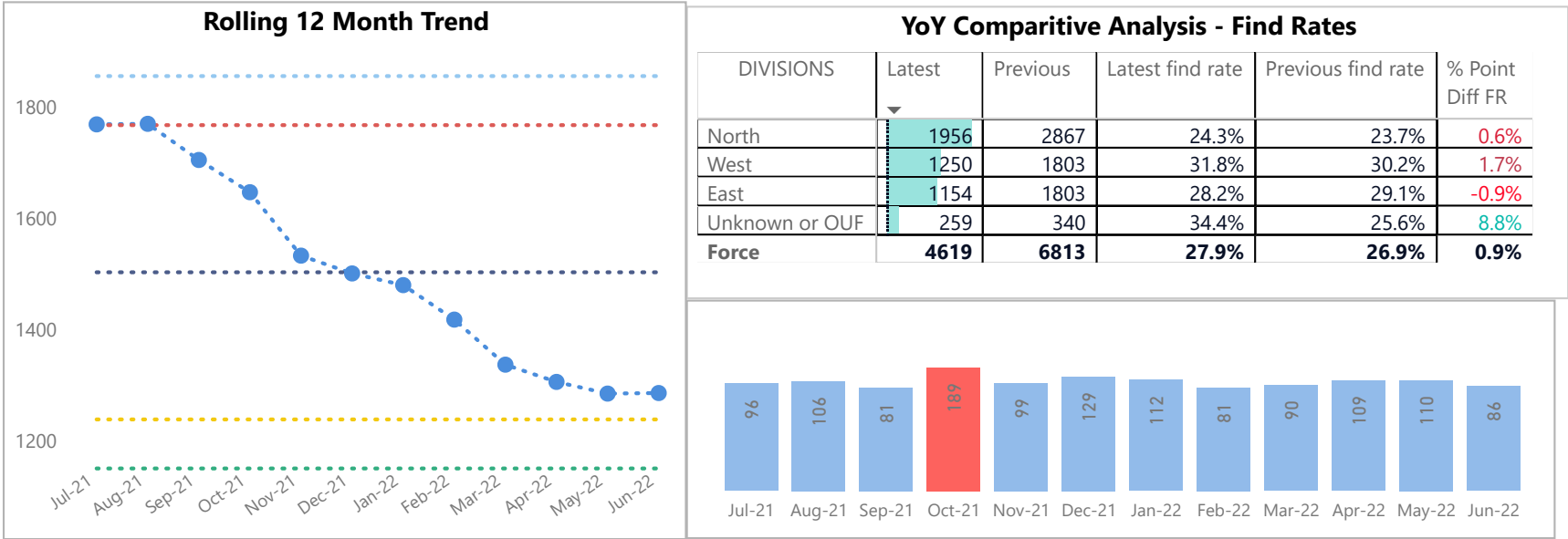

Find Rates

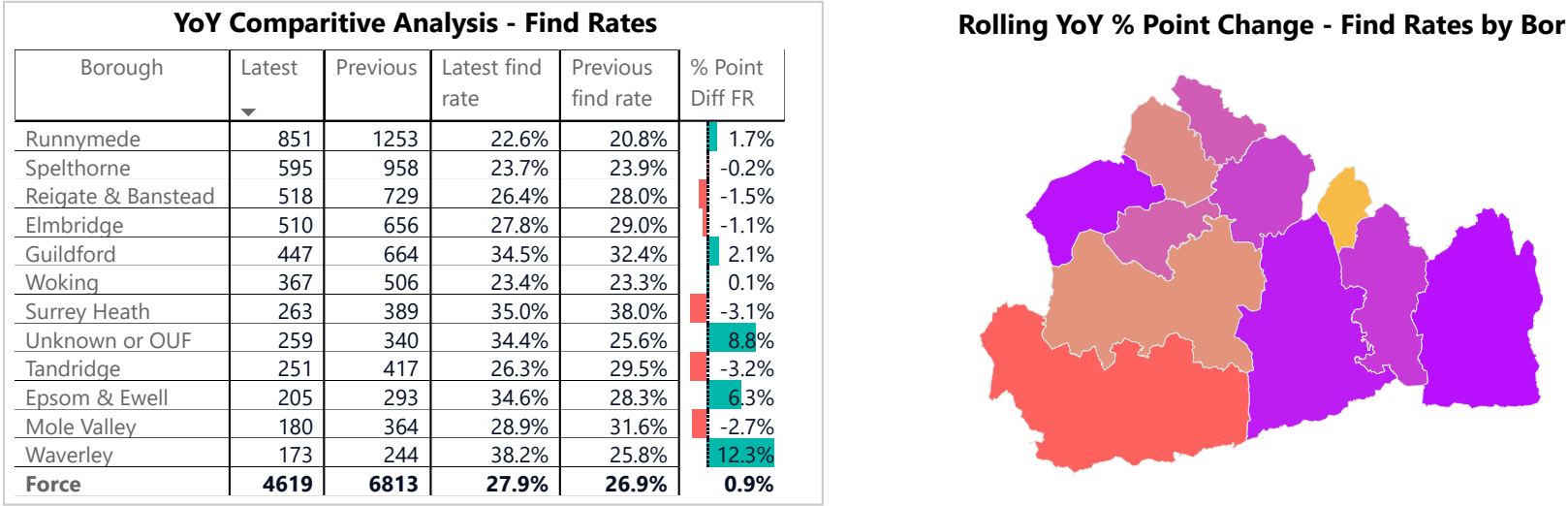
Find rates are calculated by measure the number of found items linked to the reason for stop. This looks in detail subject's location and subject characteristics and also looking at found objects broken down by location, age and ethnicity. It also highlights areas of concern due to an increase in find rates, hopefully showing the quality of Stops and to some extend justification of the use of such powers.

Rolling 12 Months Stop & search Find Rates Force and Divisions Breakdown

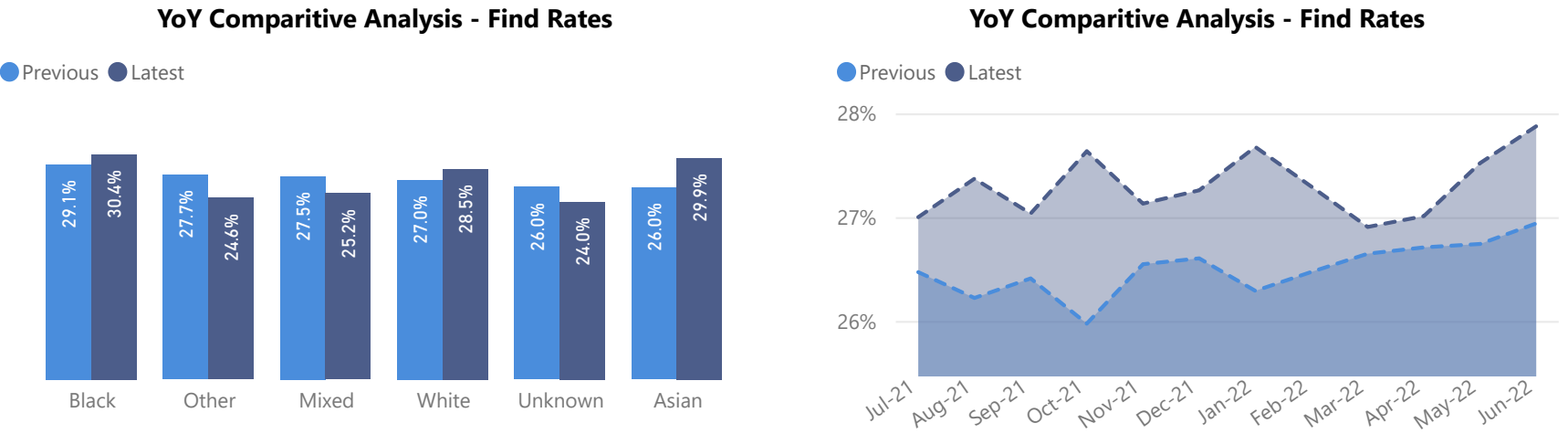


Rolling 12 Months Find Rates by Boroughs Breakdown

In the last 12 months up to 30 June 2022, Surrey Police recorded (1288) finds as a result of stops and search compared to (1836) the previous 12 months, this a (-548) difference on same period last year, and percentage difference of (0.94%), this shows a good performance in the quality of stops, but also the need for greater use of this power, although the trend shows otherwise a reduction across Surrey.



A quick analysis of find rates shows Surrey Heath as having the biggest drop in find rates of -3.1% compared to previous 12 months, which is ranked 7/11 for volumes. Overall there has been a 1.0% change in find rate performance across Surrey.



Stops By Powers and Stop Initiation

We have seen -29% decrease in drugs searches across the force, the proportion of drug related searches is still high at 66.5% of total stop reasons in the last 12 months. We have seen a significant drop in Drug searches across the force and almost up to 40% in Reigate & Banstead.

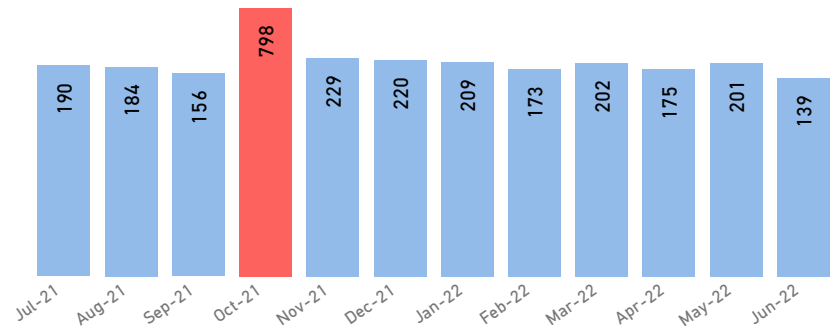
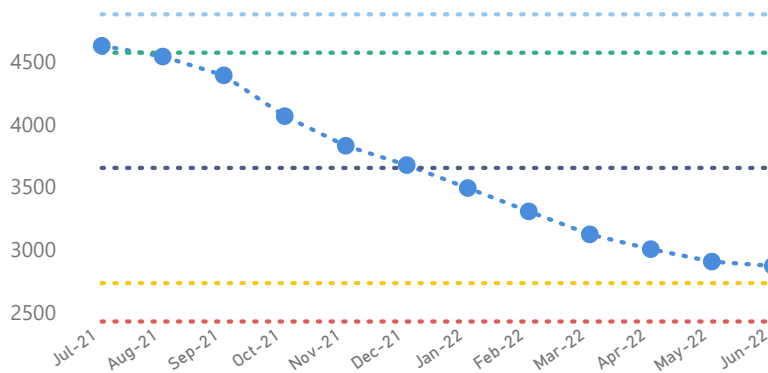

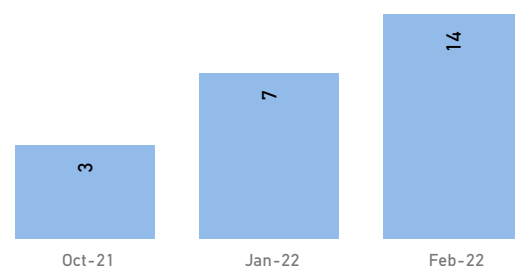

S60 Stops Locations and MoM Volumes



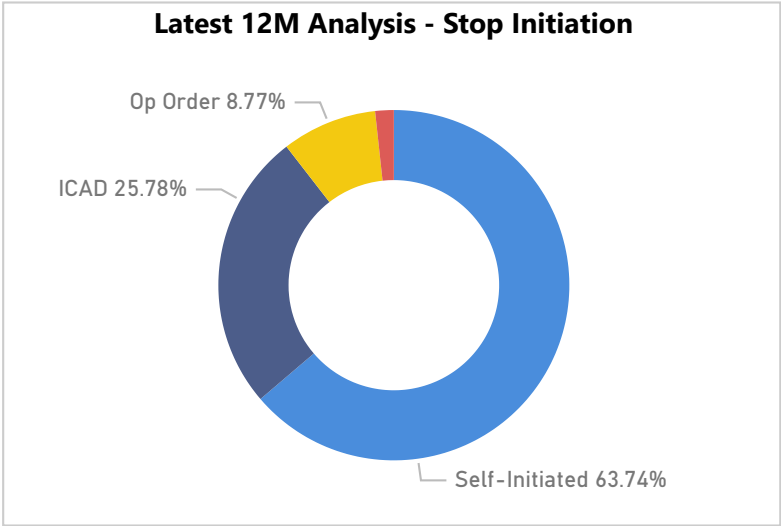
Stop Initiation

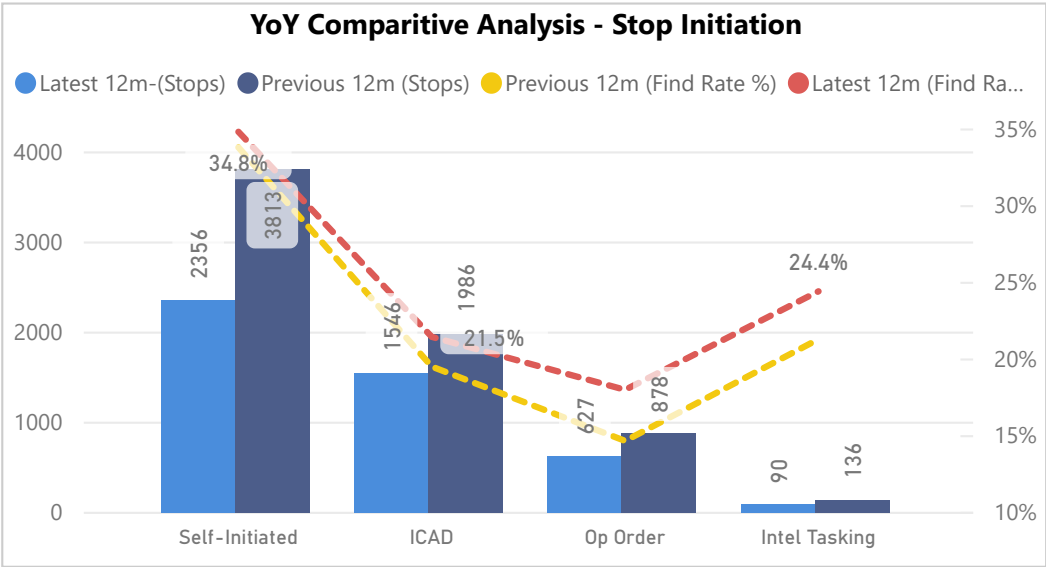

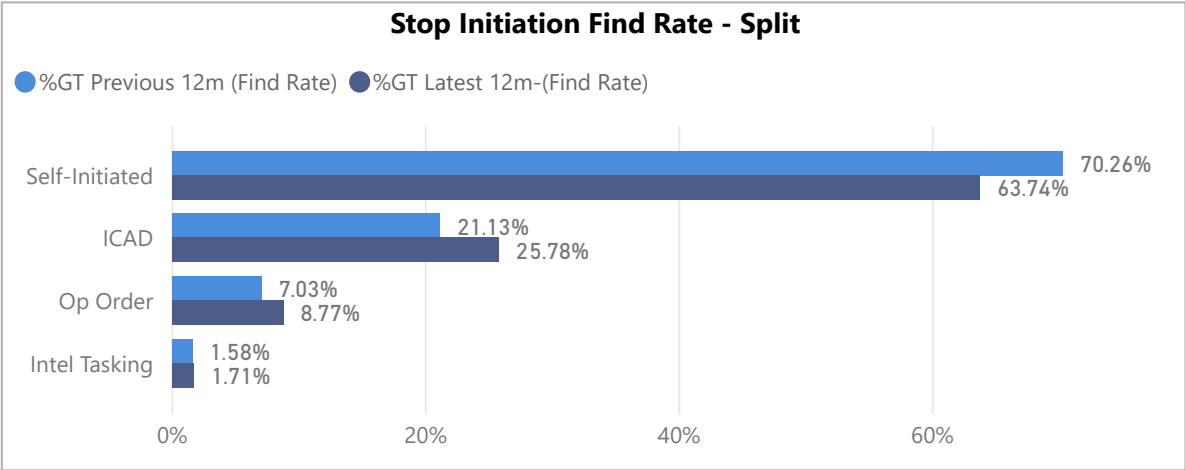

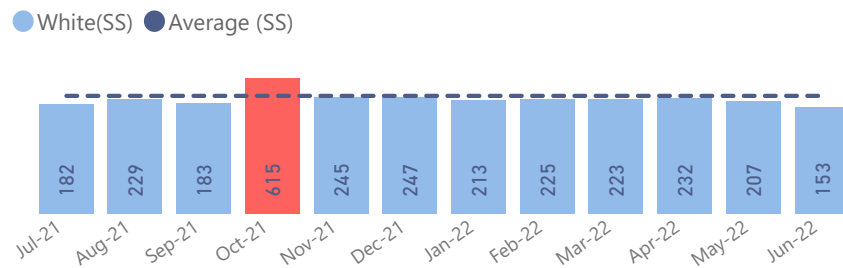
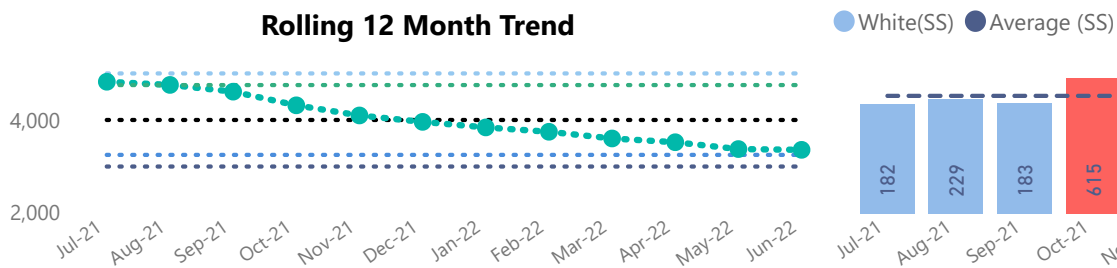


Stops Search By Ethnicity

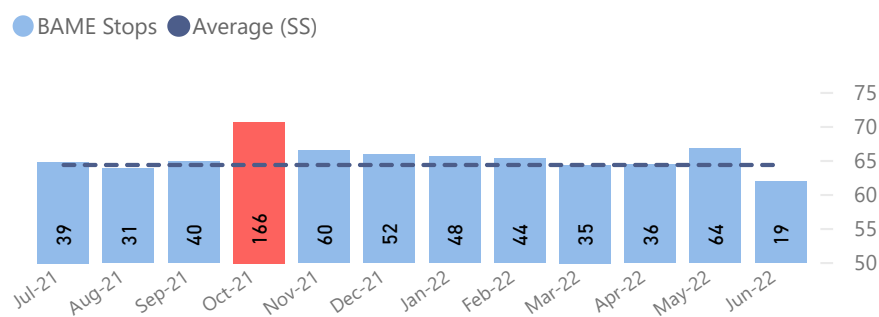
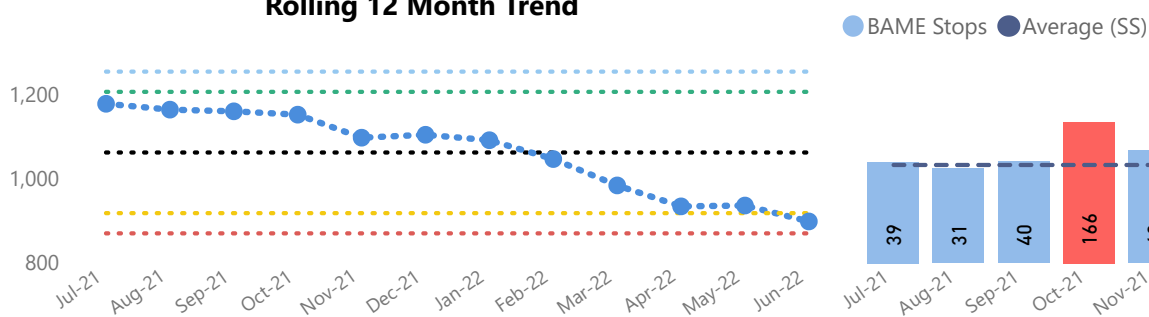
Rolling 12 Month Trend



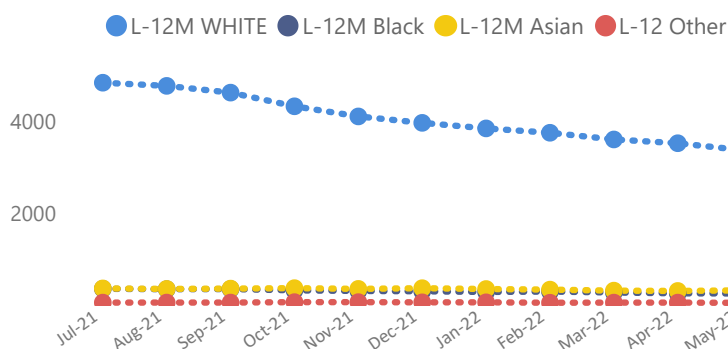
Rolling Year Volumes - BAME

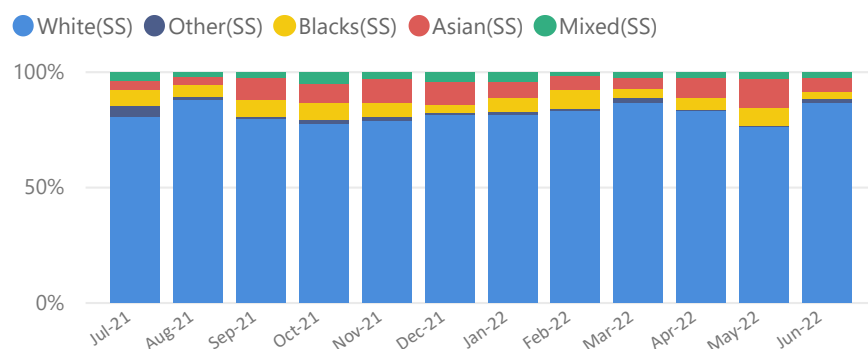
Rolling 12 Month Trend

Latest 12 Monthly Volumes (%) by Ethnic Group

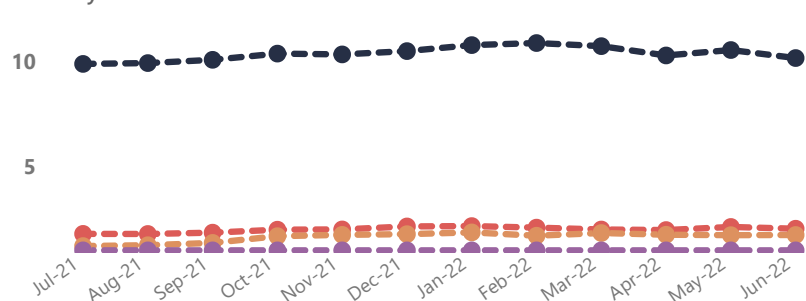


Rolling Year Volumes - BAME Disproportionality

Rolling 24 month Ethnic Dispro Trend

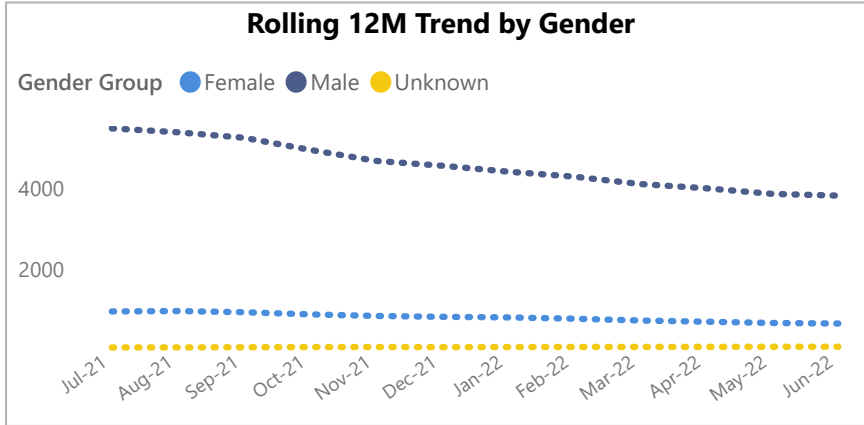

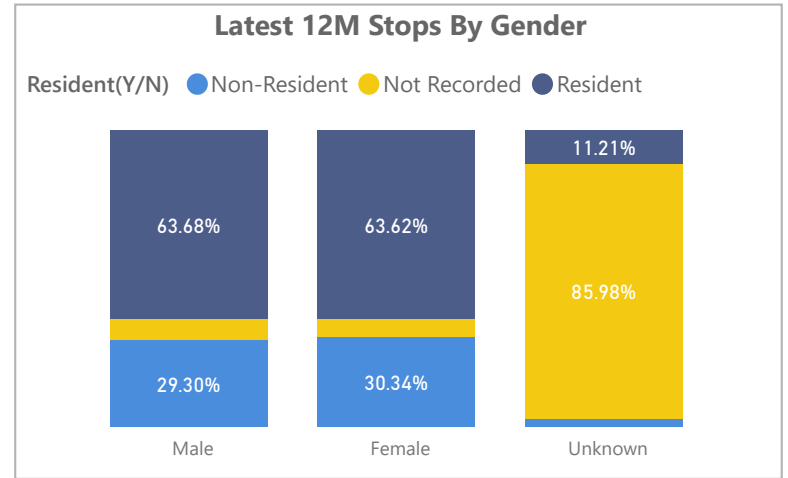

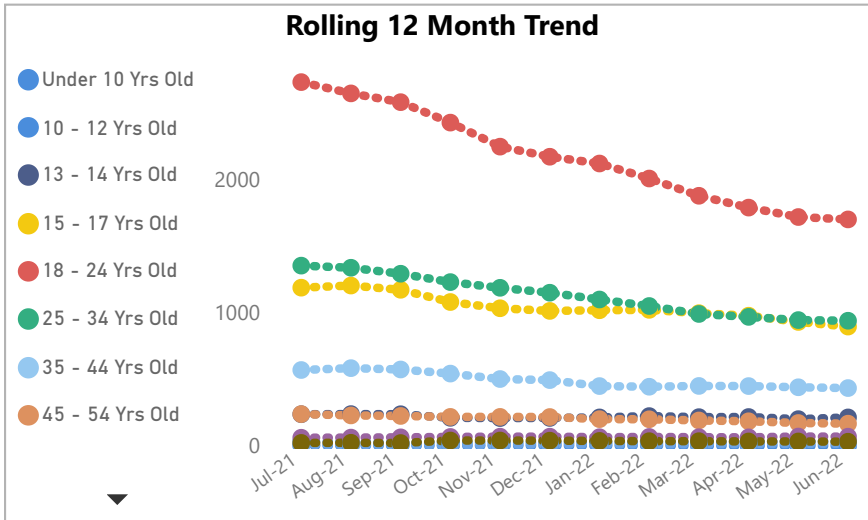
